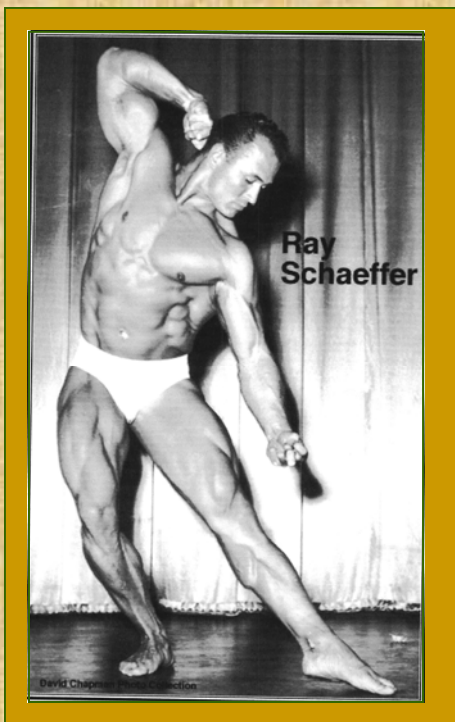

GETTING TO KNOW JEAN & RAY SCHAEFER

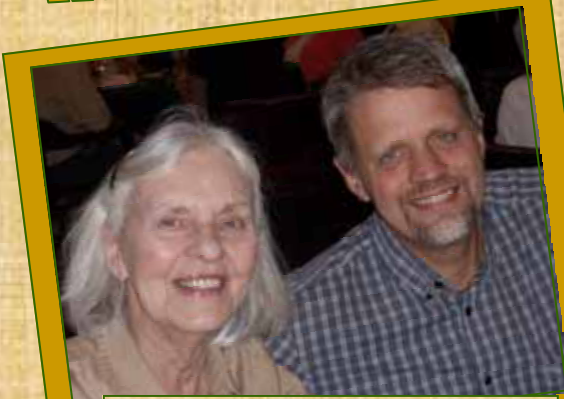

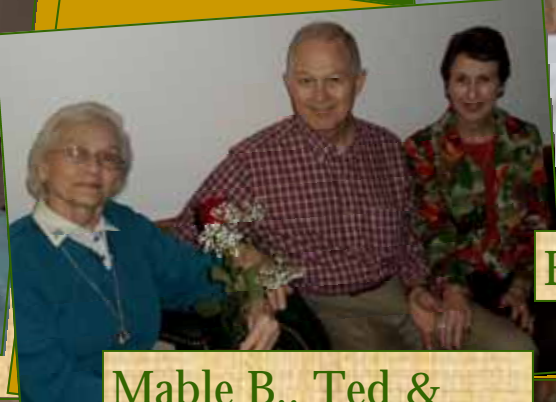

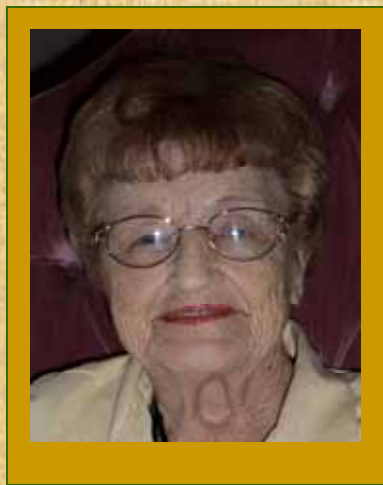
KAREN'S KORNER...
